Obesity is linked to over 200 other chronic health complications including breast and ovarian cancers and fertility challenges.2



Women living with obesity earn 9% less than women without obesity.3

Health insurance barriers place obesity care options, especially medications, out of reach for many women in Ohio.



Only 11% of Ohioans have health insurance plans that cover obesity medications 4



Ohio Medicaid does not cover obesity medications.4

In addition to obesity management medications, evidence-based, comprehensive obesity care includes:5

- Nutrition services
- Intensive behavioral therapy
- Weight-loss surgery
- Physical activity

obesity has a significant financial impact on the state of Ohio

Reduced economic activity in Ohio by \$19.5 billion⁶



Increased Ohio employers' healthcare costs by \$2.2 billion⁶
